Nursery News

Nursery Developments and things to look out for.....

Garden Developments

Lots of exciting things are happening in our gardens. In our 2 year old garden, the sand pit is working really well and the staff and Caretaker have worked together to improve the mud kitchen area. In the back garden, things are under way with growing and planting. We are working on setting up our green house and are accessing some support from Durham County's Early Years Team around a growing project.



Our Caretaker, John, has worked really hard to improve our gardens and has planted lots of spring bulbs. He really can put his hand to anything, after creating our reindeer, we wonder what might come next!!! Hopefully we will have a new wooden cabin installed in our garden across the Easter break. This will give us a break out area in the garden and will also provide a new shaded learning area for when the weather improves. We hope you like the changes we have made to our indoor environments. The children are accessing the learning space well and are very purposeful in their play.

World Book Day and Take a book home- Thursday 5th March

World Book Day is Thursday 5th March. We are asking children to come to nursery in their pyjamas for a Bedtime Story day. There will be lots of exciting activities to join in with, all relating to favourite stories.



On this day, all children will borrow a book they have chosen from nursery. The book does not need to be returned until Monday 9th March, so please read it lots of times at home! At nursery we promote repeated reading, with children listening to the same story many times. This supports them in learning new words and sounds, gaining an understanding of story structures and lets them join in and answer questions.

Please remember that you can borrow books from our Lending Library as we have noticed that this has not been used as frequently lately. If your child is interested in a particular book or has a certain interest, please let their key person know. We have lots of books and we are sure we can find the right one!

Starting Primary School

Many of our children will leave us in July, ready to start Primary School in September 2020.

If your child turns 4 before August 31st 2020, you should have completed an application for school. If you have not done this, please speak to Natalie and we can help you.

You should find out if your child has a place at their preferred school in April. After this point, will we be talking to feeder schools about visits and transition arrangements.

Parent Questionnaire

You will soon receive a parent questionnaire. Please fill it in and return it to your child's key person, or the office. Your views are really important to us and help us to improve our practice and the services we provide.

School Fund

Please could we remind parents that we ask for £1 school fund per week to support with purchasing snacks and baking ingredients. This should be given to your child's key person each week.

Children's Absences

We realise that there have been many bugs and viruses going around and at times when children are poorly, it is sometimes better that they remain at home.

Although this is the case, our Attendance figures are lower than we would hope for at the moment, with many children missing a number of days each week. We actively promote good attendance, ready for when children begin statutory education and hope that you will support us with this.

Can we reassure parents that we will always ring you if your child is unwell at nursery. It is also good to know that we can administer medication, including calpol, if a parent has filled in a form.

Please let us know as soon as possible if your child is poorly on 0191 5865415. If the school does not receive a phone call, the secretary will ring to make sure everything is ok.

Farm Visit

We are planning some visits to Tweddle Farm at Blackhall during the Summer Term.

The children in the 3-4 year old room will attend the farm with our staff, however we will ask that a parent or adult is able to attend with the children from our 2 year old room. This is due to the ratio of adults needed for our youngest learners. You will receive a letter containing all the required information in the near future.
